THE NATIONAL BOOK AWARDS consist of \$1,000 prizes in each of ten categories. They are presented annually for distinguished books written (or translated) by American citizens and published in the United States during the Award year. Four of the Awards are contributed by the American Booksellers Association, the Association of American Publishers, the Children's Book Council and the National Association of College Stores.
